ABOUT CONFIRMATION

By the Sacrament of Holy Baptism we are made full members of the Body of Christ. We are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. This service of Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation is a communal and individual celebration of and commitment to the responsibilities of Holy Baptism. Those who will be Received have already been confirmed in the apostolic tradition (Roman Catholic or Eastern Orthodox) and are now choosing to become members of the Episcopal Church. Typically, those who Reaffirm their baptismal vows may or may not be confirmed or members of the Episcopal Church, but they wish to make their faith commitment public and to receive the prayers and support of the community. Those who will be Confirmed will receive the apostolic blessing through the ritual laying on of hands by a bishop.

Candidates for Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation are presented by sponsoring clergy and asked to reaffirm their renunciation of evil and to renew their commitment to Jesus Christ. The witnessing community also reaffirms its vow to support the candidates in their life in Christ. It is in the context of this community of believers that the Christian life and commitment finds its deepest and fullest expression.

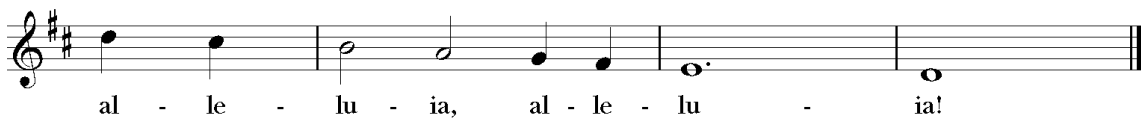

THE SECOND LESSON

Romans 12:1-8

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.
