The Associate Rector is deeply rooted in the Jesus-centered life, energized by preaching and teaching, and passionate about forming disciples of every age. You serve in a gifted and collegial clergy team and share in the full range of parish ministry with curiosity, warmth, and theological depth.

Primary Responsibilities

Worship & Preaching

- Participate in the regular rotation of celebrating the Eucharist across Sunday services (currently 8 AM Rite I, 9 AM outdoor Rite II, and 10 AM choral Rite II)
- Preach on a regular rotating basis, bringing faithful and engaging sermons that connect the Gospel to contemporary life
- Assist with the full sacramental life of the parish, including baptisms, weddings, and funerals
- Participate in the weekly "Rev'd Up for Sunday" podcast – a lively theological discussion preparing the congregation for the Sunday scripture
- Lead or co-lead classes and small groups as needed

Youth & Confirmation Ministry

- Develop and lead Confirmation preparation and ongoing formation for confirmands
- Serve as a key pastoral presence for middle school and high school youth, including social and service opportunities
- Collaborate with lay leaders and staff to build a vibrant, Christ-centered culture among young people
- Serve as Chaplain to the Preschool, leading weekly chapel

Outreach & Service Ministries

- Provide clergy leadership and pastoral support for outreach and service ministries, including Laundry Love, the Gospel Garden, Matthew 25 programs, Samaritan Ministry, and others
- Help inspire and equip parishioners to live out their faith in service to the wider community

Pastoral Care & Parish Life

- Share in pastoral care of parishioners in times of need, crisis, illness, and grief
- Be a visible, warm, and accessible presence at parish gatherings, coffee hours, and community events
- Participate in staff meetings, vestry meetings, clergy team collaboration, and ongoing professional development

Qualifications

- Ordination to the priesthood in the Episcopal Church (or another church in the Anglican Communion in good standing)
- Master of Divinity degree
- A deep and evident personal faith and commitment to the Jesus-centered, disciple-making mission of St. Mark's
- Demonstrated gifts in preaching, teaching, and pastoral care
- Experience with or genuine passion for youth and young adult ministry
- Warmth, humor, intellectual curiosity, and an ability to connect authentically with people of all ages
- Collaborative and collegial approach to parish ministry within an experienced professional staff
- Comfort with media and digital communication (podcast participation, livestreamed worship, social media)

Compensation and Additional Information

- Compensation includes salary, SS allowance, CPG pension, fully paid group life, medical, dental and vision insurance.
- Housing is provided in a single-family home adjacent to and private from the church campus.
- A three-month sabbatical is offered after every five years of service.
